1 What this sheet practises

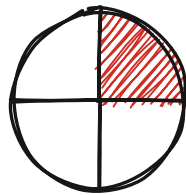
Splitting circles and rectangles into 2 or 4 equal parts, and naming them halves and fourths. Your child shades one part of each.

2 A problem from the sheet, worked out

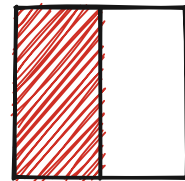
Halves and fourths How many equal parts? Shade one of them.

How: Check that the parts are the same size first. Two equal parts are halves; four equal parts are fourths, or quarters. More parts means each part is smaller.

3 Words to know

equal parts pieces that are all the same size

half one of 2 equal parts

fourth one of 4 equal parts; also a quarter

whole the full shape, before it's cut

4 Watch for

- Calling a shape cut into unequal parts halves.
- Shading more than one part.
- Thinking a fourth is bigger than a half because 4 is bigger than 2.

5 Where it fits
