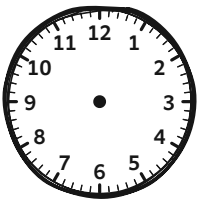

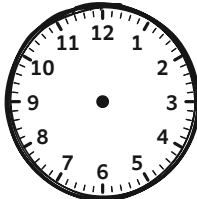

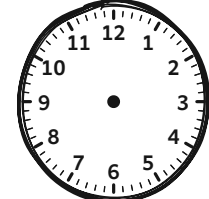

3 Words to know

hour hand the short hand

minute hand the long hand

a.m. from midnight to noon

p.m. from noon to midnight

4 Watch for

- Reading the next hour when the hour hand is only close to it.
- Writing the number the minute hand points at, like 3 for 15 minutes.
- Mixing up the hour and minute hands.

5 Where it fits
